## Promotional Campaign - Private Yachts below 24 m wishing to change flag from Delaware to San Marino

San Marino Ship Register will apply a €400 discount fee to all vessels currently deleting from the flag of Delaware and looking to change flags.

The San Marino Administration requires a deletion certificate from Delaware or, in alternative, a copy of the application/request to delete as well as proof of non-encumbrance if not already included in the bill of sale.

Owners can register in San Marino as individuals with only a copy of passport.

Should the owner wish to register as a company, they must provide a certificate of incumbency from the Delaware Division of Corporations, not older than amonths, which liet sall beneficiaries and UBO of the company.
